
Then the wolves heard a different noise. The noise came closer and closer. "Who is coming to the cave?" Mother Wolf said. She was worried.




Evening came and rain hit the window. I heard a noise and I looked at the big bed. "My uncle died in that bed," I thought. "Is his ghost in this room?"






"But we only have two legs!" shouted the birds.
